Why is professional dental care so important to you and your pet?

Dental disease is the most common illness encountered in veterinary medicine today and affects close to 80% of pets. Unfortunately, it is also the most untreated disease.

Don't let your pet suffer in pain!

You're probably not aware that your pet may be suffering in silence with dental disease. Some pets may experience severe or sharp pain while eating. Others may act depressed. Bad breath and drooling are the most frequent signs of dental disease. Diseased gums are thickened, reddened and bleed easily.

But anesthesia for my pet's dental cleaning scares me!

The risk of allowing dental disease to continue untreated far outweighs the risks associated with anesthesia. In fact, a very sick patient, it is true that anesthesia cannot be 100% risk free for people or pets but it is possible to make it a very controlled, very low risk event. We utilize the best available anesthetic agents, sophisticated monitoring equipment, and a trained technician assigned to monitor each patient, to create the safest procedure possible for our anesthetized patients.

What is involved in a teeth cleaning and oral surgery procedure at Wexford Veterinary Hospital?

1. **Pre-anesthetic Bloodwork:** This can detect any abnormalities in organ function before anesthesia and prevent potential anesthetic complications. Anesthesia can not be administered that afternoon unless the procedure can be postponed.
2. **Intravenous (IV) Catheter and Fluid Therapy:** An IV catheter allows us to give fluids during the procedure, offer oral care if necessary, or flush the IV line if necessary. It also allows us to give fluids during the procedure, offer oral care if necessary, or flush the IV line if necessary.
3. **Anesthesia and Anesthetic Monitoring:** During an anesthetic procedure your pet is monitored by a veterinarian and a trained technician. We use a variety of anesthesia agents for the procedure. Additionally, your pet's heart rate, blood oxygen, and blood pressure are monitored throughout the procedure.
4. **Oral Examination:** The veterinarian will examine the patient's mouth, teeth, tongue, and throat. The veterinarian will also check for any abnormalities in the mouth, tongue, and throat.
5. **Dental Radiographs (X-rays):** Many dental diseases conditions cannot be properly diagnosed or treated without radiographs. We use a variety of dental radiographs to help us diagnose dental disease. The veterinarian will take radiographs of the teeth and the jawbone.
6. **Dental Cleaning:** The veterinarian will clean the teeth using a variety of dental cleaning techniques. The veterinarian will also polish the teeth and fluoride treat the teeth.
7. **Oral Surgery:** The veterinarian will perform any oral surgery that is necessary. The veterinarian will also take radiographs of the teeth and the jawbone.
8. **Post-operative Care:** The veterinarian will provide you with instructions on how to care for your pet after the procedure. The veterinarian will also provide you with information on how to care for your pet after the procedure.
